Kim Stanley Robinson is an American science fiction writer. He is the author of more than 20 books, including the international bestselling Mars trilogy, and more recently *New York 2140*, *Aurora*, *Shaman*, *Green Earth*, and *2312*, which was a *New York Times* bestseller nominated for all seven of the major science fiction awards—a first for any book. Holly Black is the #1 New York Times bestselling author of over 30 fantasy novels for kids and teens, including Tithe, The Coldest Girl in Coldtown, Doll Bones, and The Cruel Prince. She has been a finalist for an Eisner Award, and the recipient of the Andre Norton Award, the Mythopoeic Award and a Newbery Honor. Her books have been translated into 32 languages

Eric Wilkerson has had an unhealthy addiction to Eric Wilkerson science fiction since 1987. The genre is something he's been passionate about ever since being introduced to *Star Trek* as a child. Jon Singer has been attending Boskone (albeit somewhat irregularly) since at least 1975. He is passionate about tweaking and fixing and upcycling and making things, and he takes particular delight in combining ingredients or techniques from disparate realms. When he heard about the YInMn blue pigment and wanted to see what it looked like, he made some; but it's a bit more complicated than that — for one thing, he didn't have a hydraulic press or an easy way to get one, so he constructed a substitute. Art Show Rates

The basic unit of space for flat work is the panel, which is made of pegboard (holes 1" apart) and is 4' high by 6' wide. For 3-D art, the basic unit is the table, which is 6' long by 30" deep. The available units and their prices are as follows:

1 unit: \$442 units: \$88

• 3 units: \$132 (returning artists only)
